Legal Guidelines for Unlicensed Practitioners

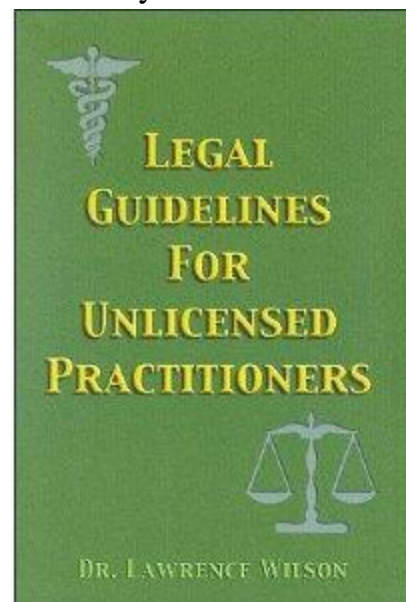
